Red Wines

Louis Latour 'Domaine de Valmoissine' Pinot Noir

£14.99 (Club RRP £29.99)

Made on the site of an abandoned monastery at the same altitude as the Grand Cru red Burgundies which made Latour's name. Cherry. Raspberry. Blackcurrants. It's fruity – but with a savoury edge which is pure Pinot.

Bodegas Bardos Ribera del Duero Reserva

£15.99 (Club RRP £31.99)

This Reserva is made from low-yielding Tempranillo and Cabernet Sauvignon vines. Aged for 16 months in French oak, it has excellent structure, with balanced tannins and refreshing acidity. Discover rich notes of dark fruit, chocolate, vanilla and smoky-wood spice.

Beronia Rioja Reserva

£14.99 (Club RRP £26.99)

This Reserva spends 20 months ageing in oak, creating a deliciously velvety red. It's rich, ripe and full of red-fruit flavour. The oak-ageing shows itself in elegant toasty notes of coconut and vanilla, rounded off with spice and smooth tannins.

Selvapiana Chianti Rufina Riserva DOCG

£17.99 (Club RRP £34.99)

This is a perfumed, elegant red with fine-grained tannins, flavours of dark cherries and spice and a freshness on the finish.

Surani 'Costarossa' Primitivo di Manduria DOC

£9.99 (Club RRP £24.99)

It's full of plummy, red-fruit flavour with moreish spice. Ageing in oak for a year gives it an extra dimension of flavour, smoothing the plush tannins. With a distinctly Italian hint of woody herbs

Domini Veneti 'La Casetta' Valpolicella Ripasso DOC Superiore

£15.99 (Club RRP £31.99)

This is Valpolicella Ripasso with a difference. Ripasso wines are made by adding the leftover grape skins from Amarone production to standard Valpolicella, giving greater depth of flavour, texture and tannin. But Domini Veneti's winemakers go a step further to make La Casetta. They re-ferment the wine with skins leftover from making Recioto – an intensely rich dessert wine – which pushes it into another dimension of flavour. Consider this an exceptional value 'Baby Amarone'. It's intense and spicy with rich, heady aromas. Expect notes of plum, cherry, chocolate and dried fruits.

Pelleriti 'Signature' Malbec

£14.99 (Club RRP £29.99)

Marcelo Pelleriti is the first Latin American winemaker to ever score a perfect 100 Parker Points. He has more than 30 years of winemaking experience between Bordeaux and Argentina. And he certainly knows a thing or two about creating first-class wine in the Malbec capital of the world, Mendoza. This is a ripe and fruity wine, with notes of black fruit, red berries and jam.

Paul Jaboulet Aîné 'Parallèle 45' Organic Côtes du Rhône

£11.99 (Club RRP £24.99)

This Grenache-Syrah blend is named after the 45th parallel north – the circle of latitude, which passes close to the winery, located close to the famous hill of Hermitage. Along with traditional barrel ageing, the wine spends a few months in stainless steel tanks, helping retain freshness and lively aromas. It's wonderfully fragrant, with floral, bramble and sweet spice notes.

Piccini Brunello di Montalcino DOCG

£28.99 (Club RRP £56.99)

Brunello di Montalcino is one of the finest expressions of the Sangiovese grape, famed for its bold, complex and full-bodied character. Piccini captures all those qualities here. Discover intense flavours of black cherry, blueberry, spice and liquorice, with silk-smooth tannins and a long, elegant finish.

Château Grand Faurie La Rose Saint-Émilion Grand Cru

£19.99 (Club RRP £39.99)

It's made from vines that have an average age of 30 years, so the flavours are particularly intense, and 12 months of oak ageing give it an elegant, silky texture. Rich yet fresh, it has complex notes of blackcurrant, cherry, and earthy spice.

Baron Edmond de Rothschild Montagne-Saint-Émilion

£24.99 (Club RRP £44.99)

One of the only Saint-Émilion satellite appellations with high enough quality wines to use the Saint-Émilion name. Thanks to its Rothschild winemakers, it punches well above its price point. It's rich, savoury and full of both fresh- and dried-fruit flavours.

Muga Rioja Reserva

£19.99 (Club RRP £39.99)

Muga is arguably the most traditional bodega in Rioja. It's based next to the railway station – the heart of old Haro, and there's not a stainless-steel tank in sight. They even have their own cooper to give their barrels the perfect amount of toasting. Unsurprisingly, this Reserva is a real classic. It's a masterclass in ageing, spending 36 months in oak before further resting in the bottle. The long maturation gives it incredible structure and complexity. Full. Smooth. Supple. Its flavours are richly complex. Think blackberry, vanilla, coffee and a hint of spice.

Château Batailley 'Lions de Batailley', Pauillac

£34.99 (Club RRP £69.99)

This is the second wine of Château Batailley, one of the oldest estates in the Médoc, and its first vines were planted in the 16th century. The château's wines gained a great reputation and it was recognised in the prestigious 1855 Bordeaux Classification as a Fifth Growth. Over the past few decades, there has been an even greater emphasis on quality of fruit. Expect intense flavour, great structure and ripe tannins. You'll find it fresh and earthy, with aromas of tobacco, raspberries and red cherry.

E. Guigal Châteauneuf-du-Pape

£37.99 (Club RRP £65.99)

The Guigal family may have made their name with iconic Côte-Rôtie. But they also produce fantastic Châteauneuf-du-Pape from 45-year-old vines. And the critics can't get enough of it. This is a full-bodied, velvety and powerful wine, with notes of red fruits, plum, hazelnut and spice.

Rustenberg 'Peter Barlow', Stellenbosch

£32.99 (Club RRP £62.99)

This powerful Cabernet Sauvignon is made from grapes hand-picked from a single vineyard and aged for a luxurious 20 months, concentrated flavours of cassis, black cherries and herbs.

Duckhorn Cabernet Sauvignon, California

£54.99 (Club RRP £89.99)

Duckhorn is a Napa Valley icon. Its winemaking team are taking on a new terrain in Sonoma. The best part? The delicious wine made there is a fraction of the usual asking price. It's a rich, ripe Cabernet Sauvignon, with flavours of black fruits, plum, cedar and spice.

Allegrini Amarone della Valpolicella Classico DOCG

£69.99 (Club RRP £114.99)

Concentrated dried-cherry aromas and a distinctly rich, powerful wine. Allegrini's version, made in the heart of the prestigious Valpolicella Classico sub-region, strikes a happy balance between modernity and tradition. Expect intense notes of ripe dark fruit and spice.

Château Batailley, Pauillac

£61.99 (Club RRP £118.99)

Château Batailley is one of the oldest estates in the Médoc, and its first vines were planted in the 16th century. The château's wines gained a great reputation and it was recognised in the prestigious 1855 Bordeaux Classification as a Fifth Growth. Over the past few decades, there has been an even greater emphasis on quality of fruit. It's a classic Pauillac with intense flavour, great structure and ripe tannins. You'll find it fresh and earthy, with forest-floor, tobacco, cassis and chocolate notes.

White Wines

Louis Latour Mâcon-Lugny

£13.99 (Club RRP £28.99)

Lugny is one of the best regarded villages in the Mâcon, and Latour one of the most famous houses. Honeyed. Peachy. Crisp.

Domaine de Saint Ferréol Viognier, Languedoc

£14.99 (Club RRP £29.99)

Reminiscent of Condrieu but come without the usual price tag. This wine is partially fermented and matured in French oak on its lees, giving it a lush complexity. It has flavours of peach, apricot, honeysuckle and spice.

Roberto Sarotto 'Campo dell'Olio' Gavi di Gavi DOCG

£15.99 (Club RRP £29.99)

It's made from 100% Cortese grapes on a 2-hectare vineyard and went through a long, cool fermentation process to draw out the grape's signature aromatics. Add a further three months resting on lees, and you're in for a seriously textured wine. Expect floral notes, with hints of pineapple, apricot and peach.

Muga Rioja Blanco

£12.99 (Club RRP £24.99)

Muga are as classic as Rioja gets. They even make their own oak barrels to get the ageing process spot on. Their reds may make the headlines, but this Rioja Blanco is a real hidden gem. It's rested on its lees and aged in oak for three months. As a result, there's a deliciously subtle texture to its flavours of citrus, apple and white flowers.

Martín Códax 'Cantigas' Albariño, Rías Baixas

£17.99 (Club RRP £32.99)

The grapes for this wine are picked from vines over 100 metres above sea level. This slows the grapes' maturation, meaning that once they reach ripeness, they're filled with intense flavour. Expect mineral-lined flavours of plush stone fruit

Domaine Pierre Marchand 'Les Cigales' Pouilly-Fumé

£15.99 (Club RRP £32.99)

This has aromatic notes of citrus, blackcurrant leaf and gooseberry. The finish is elegant and long with hints of flinty minerality and ripe apple.

Château De Crezancy Sancerre

£19.99 (Club RRP £39.99)

It's mouthwateringly fresh with aromas of citrus, white peach, pear and a hint of white pepper.

Moillard-Thomas Chablis

£16.99 (Club RRP £32.99)

This is a wine with complexity, minerality and fresh aromas of white-stone fruits and citrus.

Catena Zapata 'Catena Alta' Chardonnay, Mendoza

£23.99 (Club RRP £44.99)

It's made in vineyards up to a towering 4,757 feet above sea level. Chardonnay grapes benefit from a long ripening period at this height. So this is absolutely delicious. It has notes of pear, peach, citrus and jasmine.

Pouilly-Fumé de Ladoucette, France

£32.99 (Club RRP £59.99)

Father-and-son team Jean and Vincent Chatelain are the 11th and 12th generations of an illustrious Loire wine making family. In fact, the family has been making Loire wines since 1630! This unrivalled level of expertise is translated into this beautiful Sauvignon Blanc that's intense, mineral and concentrated with white-fruit, gooseberry and flint flavours.

DeMorgenzon 'Reserve' Chenin Blanc, South Africa

£26.99 (Club RRP £54.99)

DeMorgenzon means 'the morning sun' in Afrikaans. The name comes from the vineyard's location. At a high altitude of 250-300 metres above sea level, it's the first spot in the Stellenbosch Kloof Valley to catch the day's rays. This is made from 100% Chenin Blanc vines planted in the 1970s. It's wonderfully balanced with both freshness and complexity, thanks to barrel fermentation. It's a lushly fragrant wine – think orange blossom, pear, caramel and spice. There's plenty of mouth-watering acidity, too, which means it will cut through creamy sauces with aplomb.

Domaine Gérard Thomas Saint-Aubin Blanc 1er Cru

£26.99 (Club RRP £68.99)

Bordering the acclaimed vineyards of Puligny-Montrachet, Gérard Thomas produces a St Aubin premier cru that challenges its pricier neighbour. He barrel ferments this wine to give it a softer and smoother complexity. With a nose of ripe citrus, fresh peach, subtle sweet spice and hints of minerals, this is followed by gentle hazelnut aromas, lemons and limes, hints of vanilla and butter on the palate. This fantastically well balanced and complex wine.

Puligny-Montrachet 2019/20 Doudet Naudin

£69.99 (Club RRP £119.99)

Founded in 1849, Doudet Naudin is one of the most respected wineries in Burgundy. Made from old vines, from hand-picked grapes, and aged in vanilla-imparting oak for a year, its Puligny-Montrachet is a creamy cocktail of almond, honeysuckle and exotic fruits.
